## McCaig's Tower

The brainchild of local banker and philanthropist, John Stuart McCaig. He commissioned the structure in 1897 and was designed to provide work for local stonemasons during the winter months, but also as a monument to the McCaig family. However work stopped with his death in 1902.

## Finn Falconry

A falconry company set up to champion the importance of birds of prey to our ecosystems and habitats, through education and engagement.

## Oban's War & Peace Museum

A small, by-donation museum containing a fascinating collection of artefacts and photographs depicting the rich cultural history of the busy port town and its people.

## Dunstaffnage Castle & Chapel

One of Scotland's oldest stone castles built in 1240.

## Castle Stalker

A picturesque castle surrounded by water believed originally to have been the site of a Fortalice built around 1320.

## Kilmartin Glen

An area in Argyll which has one of the most important concentrations of Neolithic and Bronze Age remains in Scotland.
